The CSE DEI Working Group on Effective Office Hours conducted a survey of declared CS and DS students, asking them for their feedback on what mode of office hours works best for them. The survey was conducted from August 19 to 26, and it was incentivized by giving respondents the option of entering into a drawing for one of four \$50 gift cards. We received a total of 299 responses during that time period.

The survey asked each student which courses they had taken out of 16 large CS courses. For each course, it asked whether they had taken the course in an in-person or virtual/hybrid format, and whether they preferred in-person, hybrid, or purely virtual office hours for that course. We also asked what they perceived to be the benefit of each modality.

Below is a summary of the data from the survey. Overall, regardless of the modality in which students originally took a course, they strongly preferred a hybrid option for office hours. Thus, we recommend that courses provide both in-person and virtual options for office hours for the fall semester, subject to the comfort level of the teaching staff.

"As a general trend, I think that office hours for coding classes are generally well-suited for virtual office hours while office hours for theory classes are better suited for in-person. Additionally, I think that in the very early courses (ENG 101, EECS 183, 203, 280), having office hours as a means to make personal connections is an incredibly valuable experience to have as a freshman/sophomore while you are still deciding about your major."

"I definitely like the flexibility of online office hours, but I really appreciate the level of engagement with in person office hours. I have found both useful in different classes, so I think maintaining a hybrid style would be helpful to accommodate everyone."
